SIX SHOTS STYMIE LANE COVE'S FINAL CHANCES IN PENNANT

Lane Cove may have played themselves out of contention for section honours going down to Turramurra by only 6 shots in Saturday's second round.

It is statistically possible that Lane Cove can win the section, however, will have to win all four remaining matches and that Warrawee and Turramurra each have wins in the two games that they have to play against each other.

After 21 ends there was nothing between the two sides with Lane Cove trailing 15-18. The next 21 ends proved to be Lane Coves Achilles Heel winning 8 of those ends and 'bleeding' 19 shots to trail 26-48. Lane Cove held up over the next 15 ends and with 6 ends remaining trailed 39-60. Winning 4 of the last 5 ends Lane Cove posted a respectable 55 points to Turramurra's 63 points.

John Lloyd, Scott Bonthrone, Julian Barker and Stuart Smith dominated early and after 8 ends had a sizable lead of 10-2. Turramurra fought back allowing Lane Cove only 2 of the next 7 ends for Lane Cove's margin to be cut to 2 shots. With some momentum Turramurra forged ahead to lead 16-13 going into end 18. Lane Cove squared up on end 19 and 4 shots on the last end gave them a hard earned 20-17 victory.

Rohan Marshall, Kevin Mulhall, Robert Patterson and **Peter Zucconi** found it tough going for the 1st 15 ends where they won 5 of those ends to trail 6-20. As in last week's match their wont to do saw them dominate the last 6 ends scoring 14 shots to 1 to almost pull the game out of the fire failing by a single shot to go down 20-21.

Rex Johnston, **Vic Solway**, **Chris Sinclair** and **Andrew Gordon** got off to a slow start trailing 1-10 after 7 ends before winning the next 4 ends to close the gap to 3 shots trailing 7-10 after 11 ends. A 5 pointer on end 14 helped Turramurra to a sizable 22-9 lead after end 17 and this was enough to see them home 25-15.

AUSSIE DESTINATIONS – Mendooran, NSW

'Town of Murals' and the oldest town on the Castlereagh River.



Mendooran is a small rural village on the edge of the Goonoo National Park. Many of the buildings are now empty as the town competes with the nearby larger centres of Gilgandra and Dubbo. The main appeal of the town, apart from the fact that it is the oldest town on the Castlereagh River, are the murals around town (an opportunity to walk around) which depict the history of the area.

Location

Mendooran is located 379 kilometres north-west of Sydney via the Great Western Highway and the road through Mudgee and Dunedoo. It is 271 metres above sea level.

Notable People

Notable people from Mendooran include- **Ron Quinton** - Successful Jockey and Horse trainer **Katrina Gibbs** - Commonwealth Games High Jump Champion 1978, Australian National High Jump Champion 1978 and 1982 Gail Neall - Gold Medal Winning Medley Swimmer 1972 Olympics in Record Time - Taught at Mendooran Central School (Primary) in the 1970s. **Tony Chapman**, 8 time Lane Cove Bowling Club Champion was born and spent his formative years in the town.



Origin of Name

Mendooran derives its name from the original run, Mendooran, and mention is made of the settlement on the Castlereagh in Banjo Patterson's Poem "The Travelling Post Office". Known as a mural town, artist Karin Duce has painted the main street with colourful murals reflecting country life and Mendooran's history.

Mendooran Murals

In the late 1990s local artist Karin Duce started painting historical, woolshed and bushland murals relating to Mendooran on the walls of buildings around the town. It was part of a determined effort to get people to stop in Mendooran which, at the time, was dying. The result is a reminder of the life led by early settlers with images of bullocks, sheep, horses and rural life.

Banjo Paterson's The Travelling Post Office

The town is mentioned in Banjo Paterson's poem 'The Travelling Post Office':

The roving breezes come and go, the reed beds sweep and sway, The sleepy river murmurs low, and loiters on its way, It is the land of lots o' time along the Castlereagh.

The old man's son had left the farm, he found it dull and slow, He drifted to the great north-west where all the rovers go. "He's gone so long," the old man said, "he's dropped right out of mind, But if you'd write a line to him I'd take it very kind He's shearing here and fencing there, a kind of waif and stray, He's droving now with Conroy's sheep along the Castlereagh.

The sheep are travelling for the grass, and travelling very slow: They may be at Mundooran now, or past the Overflow.

History

* The first European to explore the area was John Evans in 1815.

* Evans was followed in 1817 by the explorer, John Oxley, who passed through the district.

* The town is reputedly the oldest settlement on the Castlereagh River being an important crossing point as early as the 1830s.

- * By the 1840s it was a popular stopping point.
- * In 1850 Surveyor General Thomas Mitchell officially laid out the town.
- * Land was being bought and sold by 1856.
- * By the late 1850s John Cameron had settled in the area.
- * The John Bull Inn was operating by the 1860s.
- * By 1866 there were 24 people living in the district.
- * A bridge across the Castlereagh River was completed in 1869.
- * The town was all but destroyed by a flood in 1874.
- * A school, court house and police station were all built in the early 1880s.
- * The Mechanics Institute was completed in 1935.
- * The town experienced a serious flood in 1955.

* The actor, John Hargreaves, worked as a school teacher at Mendooran Central School in the early 1960s.

* In the late 1990s Karin Duce started painting the distinctive murals which are now part of the town's attraction.

Today Mendooran (the spelling has changed since Paterson wrote the poem) is small and sleepy. It is a convenient stopover for people heading towards the Warrumbungles.



Mendooran hosts an annual agricultural show. It also hosts an annual Raceday Festival in September that sees the town population swell to above 400 as race-goers from around the world visit.

In February 2019 Mendooran was experiencing severe shortages of water and had been placed on level six water restrictions, the highest level of restrictions mandated in NSW.[2]

Mendooran formerly had a rugby league team, the Mendooran Tigers, who competed in the Group 14 Rugby League competition.
