AUSSIE DESTINATIONS – Barellan, NSW

Hometown of one of Australia's most famous female tennis players, Evonne Goolagong Cawley.



Barellan is a small service town in the heart of the Riverina which is defined by its huge pub - the Commercial Hotel; its grain silos (for this is part of the rich Riverina cereal belt); and the fact that Evonne Cawley grew up here and is now honoured by a huge tennis racquet in the main street.

Location

Barellan is located 521 km west of Sydney via the Hume Freeway to Yass and then through Temora.

Origin of Name

It has been claimed that Barellan is a local Wiradjuri word meaning "the meeting of the waters".

The Big Tennis Racquet

Barellan celebrated its centenary in 2009 with the construction of The Big Tennis Racquet. The townsfolk helped to make Evonne Goolagong a champion by lending her tennis racquets, driving her to tournaments and raising money for coaching. The \$45,000 Big Racquet honours Goolagong Cawley's remarkable achievements. It is an exact 20:1 scale replica of her famous Dunlop wooden racquet.

The Commercial Hotel

A true classic Australian rural hotel with a wide veranda. It is now totally out of proportion to the rest of the town being the largest building apart from the wheat silos. It was built in 1924.



History

.* Barellan came into existence in 1909 when the railway line arrived to service the surrounding wheat farmers who had managed to clear the surrounding mallee scrub. A post office was opened the following year.

* the town's greatest brush with fame was the international success of a local girl, Evonne Goolagong (now Evonne Cawley), who was born in 1951 in Griffith and attended Barellan Primary School. She started playing tennis in Barellan before travelling to Sydney where she developed her tennis-playing skills with the wellknown coach Vic Edwards while attending Willoughby Girls High School on Sydney's lower North Shore.

BOGGO ROAD GAOL



Boggo Road Gaol opened in 1883 as a replacement for the dreaded Brisbane Gaol on Petrie Terrace and closed its heavy reinforced doors for the last time in 1992. Today only a few buildings remain of the infamous establishment which in its time held a cast of Queensland's most notorious prisoners. Of the hundred years' worth of buildings

that have stood here, the main ones still standing are Division 2 (the state's only remaining prison building based on the 19th century principles of control and discipline), its brick-enclosed exercise yard and observation tower. Long time Brisbane residents will recall the unsettling sight of armed guards on patrol in the tower when driving along Annerley Rd.

Constructed in 1903 as a separate Women's' Prison block to the 1887 built men's block Division 1, Division 2 was the first 'separate system' women's gaol in Queensland and the worn words HM Prison for Women (with the 'wo' scrubbed clean) over its foreboding arch can still be seen even though it ceased being a women's section in 1921.

After the women were moved out in 1921 to another building at the southern end, Division 2 became a catchment for long-serving prisoners – killers, rapists and other serious criminals - of St Helena Island. In the 1970's it reverted to a maximumsecurity prison after Division 1, along with its infamous 'Black Peter' damp earthen underground holes for solitary confinement was demolished and replaced with a new facility.

As the oldest and most archaic of the surviving intact gaol buildings Division 2 became the site of much protest, rioting, hunger strikes and wire swallowing by prisoners held there in the early 1980's, with convicted Whiskey Au Go Go fire bombers Stuart and Finch at the forefront.

Other famous Boggo Road Gaol inmates were Patrick Kenniff, Australia's last bushranger who was executed here in 1903 and buried across the road in South Brisbane Cemetery, Ernest Austin who killed a 12yo girl in Samford and was the last man to be executed in Qld and Slim Haliday who was renowned for his six ingenious escape attempts.

Most early prisoners who met their deaths by hanging were buried across the road at the then South Brisbane Cemetery and today a commemorative stone stands in the vicinity of the 41 prisoners listed as 'dead by the gallows'.

OLDER AUSTRALIANS ENCOURAGED TO ROLL BACK THE CLOCK

Lane Cove Bowling and Recreation Club is taking a step towards curbing low physical activity rates among older Australians by encouraging them to "roll back the clock" through lawn bowls.

Roll Back the Clock is a Bowls Australia initiative, in partnership with Sport Australia, that aims to boost physical activity rates among Australians aged 65 and over through bowls, light exercise and education.

Presently, as little as 25-percent of Australians over-65 meet the Department of Health's physical activity guidelines of 30 minutes of activity per day.

Health-related reasons, including physical and mental health, are the main barriers for older Australians participating in sport or physical activities and bowls is seen as a low-impact, socially-inclusive activity that can be enjoyed by individuals of all ages.

Roll Back The Clock programs incorporate a two-part activity lasting 30 minutes each, targeting both the body and mind through bowls, functional training, fitness and wellness education, and socialisation.

Sessions are adapted for individuals, with benefits ranging from enabling participants to perform activities of daily life more easily, to withstanding injuries and providing a sense of accomplishment and achievement.

In addition to the physical health benefits, engaging in physical activity and group sports for older Australians provides increasingly important opportunities for socialisation, peer-support, and conversation that reduces the possibility for loneliness related physical and mental **illnesses.**



Roll Back The Clock will be staged regularly at Lane Cove Bowling and Recreation Club, over 8 weeks, commencing 18 July 2023. Cost: \$80
