LANE COVE TEAM RUNNERS-UP BY BAREST MARGIN IN ROSEVILLE SHIELD

Lane Cove's **Kay Mulhall** (lead), **Stuart Smith** (2nd), **Kevin Mulhall** (3rd) and **Sarah Hobson** (skip) were at the top of their game in nearly pulling off the time-honoured Roseville Shield at Lindfield Bowling Club last Saturday.

Due to Covid-19 and poor weather conditions the event was cancelled over the last three years.

Twenty-two teams from Zone 9 clubs participated, including a Zone 9 composite team and a North Shore District Women's Bowling Association team).

After two matches of fours, each played over 21 ends, Lane Cove finished 2nd on the leaderboard 1 point behind the winners Manly (M. Wall, K. Smith, P. Coulton and G. Lewis).

In their first match Lane Cove had a big win over Forestville winning 14 ends with a margin on 8 shots placing them first on the leaderboard 2 shots in advance of Manly.

Their second match against Lindfield was a closer contest with Lane Cove winning 11 ends for a margin on 5 shots.

Over the competition our roving reporter noted “it was a great team effort by all four players but special mention must go to skip Sarah who made some amazing saves at critical times.”

In claiming the Roseville Shield Manly finished on 33 points ahead of Lane Cove on 32 points, Warrawee 31 points, Newport 30.5 points and Chatswood 30 points.

SILVER FOR KRIZANIC IN WORLD CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS FINAL

Australia’s **Carla Krizanic** has finished her 2022 World Champion of Champions campaign with a silver medal after falling to New Zealand’s **Tayla Bruce** 8-6 10-9 in the final at the Naenae Bowling Club.

The opening set was a seesawing battle early, as the pair exchanged scores of three in the opening two ends, and then trading singles in the next four to see the scores at 5-5 with three to play.

That was when Bruce made her pivotal move, winning five of the next six ends to close out the opener and race to a 5-0 lead in the second stanza.

Krizanic was not to be deterred, taking the next three ends as she edged ahead 6-5, aiming to force the championship match to a deciding tiebreak.

With just three ends to play, the 2022 Commonwealth Games bronze medallist wrestled the lead back from the Australian with a superb trail of the jack for two. However, the contest would have yet another momentum shift as Krizanic claimed a three on the penultimate end to boast a 9-7 buffer and leaving Bruce needing to score a multiple to take the championship.

The 27-year-old played a sensational final end, all over the jack early to take a three and the title, establishing why she was voted New Zealand’s player of the year in 2022.

In conquering the tournament, Bruce becomes the fourth New Zealander after **Jan Khan**, **Jo Edwards** and **Sandra Keith** to take home the trophy.

In the men’s event, England’s **Sam Tolchard** won an epic contest against Malaysia’s **Izzat Dzulkeple** with the final bowl of the tiebreak to take the contest 12-3 4-6 3-2

SunSmart Sport Policy - Bowls NSW

1. Policy Statement

The health of members is of primary concern for Bowls NSW.

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world. It is acknowledged that skin cancer is a preventable disease and that a preventative strategy including the following actions outlined in this Policy will be promoted by Bowls NSW.

2. Application

2.1.Shade

- Bowls NSW will encourage clubs to maximise the use of natural shade provided from buildings, trees, and other shade structures around greens for use by officials, spectators and players.
- Clubs will be informed of appropriate Grants which become available through Government bodies for this purpose.

2.2.Clothing

- Bowls NSW will promote or supply participants and officials with sun protective clothing as an option when supplying representative uniforms.
- This will include:
 - o Shirts or playing tops which have long sleeves and a collar
 - o Wide brimmed or legionnaires hats whenever practical.
- Bowls NSW will encourage members to be conscious of sun protection, when purchasing attire for playing in Association Events.
- Bowls NSW will encourage Affiliated Clubs, Districts and Zones to provide 'sun smart' clothing options for Representative and Officials Uniforms for Association Events.

2.3.Sun Protection

- At all Affiliated Bowling Clubs in NSW, Sunscreens SPF 30+ sunscreens should be promoted or provided by the club.
- Prior to training or playing in peak UV periods, players and participants will be encouraged to apply sunscreen to exposed body parts.
- At all NSW State Finals and Representative Fixtures conducted by Bowls NSW, Sunscreen SPF 30+ will be made available to all players and officials.

2.4.Education

- Bowls NSW will provide skin cancer information links through its website and magazine to increase the awareness of this health issue among members.
- Club officials/staff will act as suitable SunSmart role models.

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AUSSIE DESTINATIONS – Woodenbong, NSW

Quiet service centre near NSW-Queensland border



Woodenbong is situated in a very picturesque area nestled among mountain peaks and valleys and surrounded by World Heritage rainforests and State Forests. The area is not short of breathtaking views and scenery including some picturesque waterfalls. The village is located in the shadow of Mt Lindsay standing proudly at 1280 metres above sea level in the MacPherson Ranges/Border Ranges of Northern NSW, 10 km south of the NSW/Queensland state border.

The district is given over to dairying, timber, cattle, potatoes, maize and grazing.

Location

Woodenbong is located on the Mt Lindsay 798 km north-east of Sydney, 145 km from Brisbane and 60 km north-west of Kyogle.

Origin of Name

The name is derived from a Githabul word meaning wood ducks on water.

Tooloom Falls



Tooloom National Park, part of the Gondwana Rainforests of Australia World Heritage Area, is a great place for walking, picnicking, birdwatching and admiring the views across the Great Dividing Range.

The beautiful Tooloom Falls (10 m high, 60 m wide) have water flowing over them at most times of the year. The word Tooloom is corrupted from the Gidabal word Doolloomi, which means headlice, and it is said that these are found around the deep, potentially dangerous pool beneath the falls (but don't let that put you off!). In the gentle way that Aboriginals have with their children this was told to them to deter them from swimming there. It is also believed spirits live in the pool making Tooloom Falls one of the most significant sites in Gidibal country. It was declared an aboriginal place in 1977 under the National Park's and Wildlife Act.

Mt Lindesay



About 10 km north-east of Woodenbong is the very prominent and distinctive Mt Lindesay which stands 1195 m above sea level. A remarkable mountain it belongs to the Nandewar Range which is part of the border between New South Wales and Queensland. It is a volcanic plug from the vast shield volcano which covered this area from 21-17 million years ago.

The Nandewar Range is a complex of peaks. Mount Gillies, Mount Lindesay and Mount Glennie represent lava eruptions from the volcano. The prominent, sheer cliffs of Mount Lindesay are remnants of horizontal rhyolite lava which have subsequently been isolated by erosion. The mountain is a popular spot for mountain climbers.



History

- The rugged volcanic peaks of the district were first signed by Logan, Fraser and Cunningham in 1828.
- Shortly afterwards Francis Roberts surveyed the border between Queensland and New South Wales and passed through the area.
- The 'Keelgyrah' run was established on the southern bank of the Richmond River in 1848 by George Wyndham of Dalwood.
- In the 1890s a yowie was sighted in the area.
- Woodenbong was officially declared a village in 1908.
- At one time an Aboriginal settlement was located at Grevillea and poet Roland Robinson, with permission from the Githabul clan of the Bunjalung people, gathered their folklore and translated some into English verse.
- In the 1930s Grevillea was the headquarters of a Department of Main Roads scheme which employed 1152 men in local road building that was intended to open up grazing land for closer settlement and dairy farming.
- In 2006 the local population was 332 in Woodenbong village.

DID YOU KNOW: Antarctica holds most of the world’s fresh water. An incredible 60-90% of the world’s fresh water is locked in Antarctica’s vast ice sheet. The Antarctic ice sheet is the largest on Earth, covering an incredible 14 million km² (5.4 million square miles) of Antarctic mountain ranges, valleys and plateaus. This leaves only 1% of Antarctica permanently ice-free.

At its deepest, Antarctica’s ice is 4.5km (2.7 miles) thick – that’s half the height of Mt Everest! If it all melted, global sea levels would rise about 60 m (200 ft).

FUN FACT: Antarctica covers an area of 14.2 million km² (5.5 million square miles). This is about twice the size of Australia, and larger than the United States of America and Mexico combined.
